Wilmar Kortleever (W11 alt) was recognized for 9 years of parent volunteer service on the FSLAC. He is stepping down as his son in graduating. Matt Forrest (W 9) was recognized for serving as parent vice-co-chair for the past 2 years.

Annual Enrolment in Early French Immersion/Middle French Immersion Programs 2021-2022 and Core French Program 2020-2021 Report 2021-22

The Annual Enrolment Report for French Programs was released with the June 9 PSSC agenda and presented at the June 8 FSLAC meeting. It has enrolment numbers for Core, Extended and Immersion French programs and the application and placement numbers for French programs for entry to SKFI (70 sites), new Middle French Immersion MFI (40 sites), GR 7 Extended Program, and 1 intensive extended French program. Due to the pandemic challenges since Mar 2020, application numbers decreased this year in all Learning Centres. At least one class will open in all MFI sites next school year, with no redirection required.

French Review (FSLAC motion 1 Underserved Areas)

Motion 1, included in the May 5th PSSC Summary Report, strives for better accessibility to French Programs in historically underserved areas. In answer to this, 4 new JK/SK entry immersion locations will be announced prior to the November 2021 application period. As well, staff are working actively on Pathway changes for two middle school boundaries (one in East, one in the West) such that these changes can be shared by the November application period. Largest catchments have been prioritized with particular attention to Scarborough. Details are being reviewed with Trustees and local Principals. Staff indicate that information can be provided to FSLAC for the first meeting in September, once the catchments have been created.

Procedures: Return to French Programs, Pandemic Response

Staff sent out a return to French survey in January 2021 to offer the opportunity to return to Extended/Immersion French programs for students who left between September – December 2020. In addition, the 2020 waitlists, held at some schools, will be maintained and spots offered if space is available until September 30th2021 in accordance with PR597. Staff will do their best to be flexible, show professional judgement, which includes compassion and takes context into account, given the challenges of the past year.

The results of the system wide Selection Form going to families in August will generate data for local schools. This will enable staff to confirm the number of students selecting virtual learning and make decisions on the delivery of virtual French programming in Sept 2021.

Supporting Re-engagement for students 2021/22

Staff acknowledges that this past 16 months has been very stressful for staff, students, and parents. We will try to be flexible to ensure safety of students. Staff will welcome all students back to French in their chosen program, support them in their continued progress and continue to support inclusion of all students, including ESL. We are planning for professional learning to assist teachers with working with students in a compassionate way while building students' proficiency and confidence in French programs.

Placement Procedure - Double Cohort Year 2022/2023

All on-time JK/SK applicants will be offered placement based on procedure PR597. Planning numbers indicate room for at least a JK and a SK class in each current Early French Immersion school. Brown, for example has 1 SKFI class currently, but for the double cohort year, staff are planning for a JKFI class and a SKFI class. If either class becomes full, the procedure will be used. Balance of French and English will continue to be addressed, as approved in the LTPAS by the Trustees. It is expected that the Enrolment

report will be more complex and there are likely to be more redirections than usually required. Parents will be informed of the redirection potential.

Ward/CPF Reports

W2, W11, W14 and CPF reported. Items include: parents do not want the elementary hybrid model and appreciation for French programming during this difficult year. CPF shared that a SATEC student placed 2nd at the provincial Concours d'art oratoire and 2 new FSL initiatives in Ontario: @DistuptTextsFSL a project done by secondary FSL teachers to choose new texts to support inclusive FSL programs and Camerise https://www.yorku.ca/glendon/2021/04/23/camerise/ which will be an FSL hub for families, educators, Trustees and stakeholders.
